NHIA and IACP announce co-location of 2020 annual conferences in Denver

Alexandria, Va. (September 10, 2019) — The [National Home Infusion Association](#) (NHIA) and [International Academy of Compounding Pharmacists](#) (IACP) have announced the co-location of their 2020 annual conferences in Denver, Colorado.

NHIA, the voice of the home and specialty infusion industry, will be holding its [2020 Annual Conference](#) April 5-9, 2020, bringing together more than 1,200 industry professionals together for the industry's leading education and networking event.

IACP attendees will have the opportunity to attend NHIA's Sterile Compounding Clinic – a four-day program on sterile compounding standards and best practices and visit NHIA's exhibit floor to see innovative home infusion products and services from more than 100 companies serving the industry. There will also be joint NHIA and IACP networking opportunities.

“Each conference will retain its individual flavor and mission, but the fresh perspective and additional networking with industry professionals allows both organizations to create a big-tent event, convening significant compounding segments of the health care industry,” said IACP Executive Vice President Scott Brunner, CAE.
